



The Institute of Comparative Law and Legal Theory (University of Szeged, Faculty of Law and Political Sciences) will host the 6<sup>th</sup> annual **Workshop on Intellectual Property Rights in Szeged (WIPS)** on June 9-10, 2022 in Szeged (Hungary).

Launched in 2016, WIPS is organized by the University of Szeged to explore current issues in intellectual property law. This year's event opens two main tracks for application.

***“GLAM @ Home”***

Presenters of this track might discuss current perspectives of the European GLAM sector.

Presentations are warmly welcome related to digitization, cultural preservation, orphan works, out-of-commerce works, digital/online research and education.

This track is organised as a part of the H2020 projects *reCreating Europe* and *inDICEs*.

***Consumer protection and IP law overlaps***

This track aims to focus on the overlaps of consumer protection law and intellectual property law.

Presentations are warmly welcome related to the overlaps of intellectual property and platform economy, digital services, digital markets, blockchain, supply and conformity of digital contents and services, consumer protection.

Keynote speaker of WIPS<sup>6</sup>: ***Professor Maurizio Borghi*** (University of Bournemouth).

The conference is planned to take place in person in Szeged, Hungary. If the global pandemic necessitates so, the event will be transformed into an online event.

The workshop is also open for junior researchers having no PhD degree. Junior researchers will present their papers in a dedicated panel (“Junior Track”).
